# Staffing Structure 24/25

I am happy to announce we have no change of teachers for the new academic year however, we do have as small change to our support staff. Miss Presbury will be leaving us to start a new job for the new academic year. Miss Presbury started with us 3 years ago, as an apprentice LSA. She successfully passed her apprentice year and has been reinforcing her skill set in Honey Bees ever since. She is ready to spread her wings and we wish her well on her new adventure. Until a suitable replacement can be found, Mrs Ferris will support Honey Bee and Bumble Bee classes.

#### The Hive - Year 4,5,6

Miss Digioia will continue as our Lead Teacher and teacher in the Hive. This year, Miss Digioia will be joined by Mr Carvell, our trainee teacher. Mr Carvell will be with the Hive for the whole year, except for a few weeks between January and February half term, when he will visit a 2<sup>nd</sup> placement, as part of his training.

### Honey Bees - Year 2,3

Mr Dash will continue as teacher of Honey Bees Class and will be supported by Mrs Ferris in the mornings.

### Bumble Bee - EYFS,Y1

Miss Bray will continue as teacher of Bumble Bee Class and will be supported by Mrs Gent in the mornings and Mrs Ferris in the afternoons.

Mrs Triggs will continue to support Bumble Bee and Honey Bees from August, covering the teachers when they have their planning and preparation time and Mrs Lee will continue to support the Hive when Miss Digioia has her planning and management time.

#### Uniform

School uniform is really important part of life at Ab Kettleby Primary School. It promotes a sense of pride, a sense of belonging and maintains an equality, all of which positively contributes to the wellbeing of children. From time to time, incorrect uniform tends to creep into our school (e.g. incorrect hair accessories or sock colour, incorrect jewellery or logo shoes/trainers on non-PE days). # Statutory Attendance Guidance - August 2024

# Attendance and Punctuality

This is just a reminder to all parents of the new statutory guidance which comes into force as of August 2024. A separate letter was sent out last week which identified the importance of good attendance, punctuality, and penalties for unauthorised absences. The learning day is so full, that even one day off school can cause gaps in children's knowledge and understanding and this can have a negative effect on their self-esteem and mental health. Our aim is for children to

attend school 96% or above, this gives leeway for genuine sickness, which may occur, in the academic year. Children are required to be in school at 8:45am for registration at 8:55am. As from August we will open the gate at 8:40am and this will be closed at 8:55am. Anyone arriving after 8:55am will need to report to the office and will be marked as late.

## Social Media - Photograph Consent

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from appearing on social media posts (Facebook, Melton Times, Twitter etc). From time to time, children attend more public events, such as the end of year choir at the Theatre, and this makes it impossible to manage who is taking photographs and where those photographs will be posted. In light of this, any parent who chooses not to allow their child's photo to be used on social media, may not be able to attend such functions. We will not be able to change your consent for one off events, as we move into the new academic year.

### **Music Provision Autumn 24**

I have managed to secure a 3<sup>rd</sup> year of music provision for the Autumn Term for children in the Hive. One afternoon per week, children will learn how to play the Djembe drums September to December. Children at Somerby Primary School will also be learning to play the Djembe drums and we are hoping to bring the two classes together for a little performance for parents to watch later in the Autumn term. Each Autumn term a new instrument will be introduced, giving children the opportunity to enjoy 3 different instruments over the time they are in the Hive (Guitar - Strings, Trumpet- Brass, Djembe - Percussion).

### Extra after school club offer

In our bid to source extended school provision, we have managed to secure an extra club provision as from August. We will therefore be offering clubs 3 times a week on a regular basis. Details of all clubs will be sent out in the August Club letter.

#### **Tesco Community Grant**

We are delighted to let you know that our 2nd application to the Tesco Community Grants Scheme has been successful and our project will be put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores from the beginning of July 2024 and will continue until the end of September 2024.

Our project is to continue to develop our pond area by creating a natural environment to attract wildlife and to provide our children with an outdoor learning area to support learning, wellbeing and the mental health of our children.

The project with the highest number of votes will receive £1,500, second placed project £1,000 and the third placed project £500.
